Rules:

1. Limit: One entry only in combined market and feeder divisions.
2. Substitutions may only be made within a division: steer for steer, pig for pig etc. NO other substitution will be allowed! Exhibitor's entry may be disqualified for non compliance, such as bringing different species to fair.
3. All market Goats must be individually owned by the exhibitor and entered in the auction program for 60 days prior to the weigh-in day of the fair to be eligible for the auction. Independent exhibitors see Junior Livestock Auction rules.
4. All animals in market divisions must be free of horns (naturally polled, dehorned, disbudded or tipped).
5. Minimum scale weight 60 pounds, maximum weight 125 pounds.
6. All breeds judged together.
7. Market goats are wethers and does, no bucks allowed.
8. Market Goats must not be over one year of age.
9. Market goats must show milk teeth.
10. Market Goats must be clipped to 3/8 in., hair above the knees and hocks including the head.
11. Animals that do not meet the minimum weight requirements for market goats may be shown in the feeder class.
12. No premiums will be paid on animals sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
13. It is the intent of the Division of Fairs and Expositions and of Fairs that the quality standards established for market animals be maintained. Therefore, classifications will be subject to change in the event there are changes in Federal Grading.

 7. All females twenty four (24) months of age or older at the beginning day of the Fair must:
 - a) Have a calf, or
 - b) Show obvious signs of pregnancy;

 - d) Have a veterinarian's certificate stating that the animal is or has been an embryo producing female. (No animal that is due to calve in August is allowed to be entered at this Fair.)
 8. Nurse cows will not be permitted on Fairgrounds unless it is the natural mother, not eligible for entry but calf is eligible and if space is available.

3. Any female over 24 months of age that has not kidded and cannot prove current pregnancy will not be allowed to show.

4. All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification.
5. Percentage doe classes are for goats 50% to 87.5 % meat goat breeding. Full blood classes are for does that are 15/16 blood (93.7 %) and higher and 31/32 blood (96.8).
6. Age is calculated based on day of show.
7. Does less than 1 year of age must show kid teeth.
8. Does must be shown with natural coat, no slick shearing (excessively long hairs, around feet, inside ears, tail area, etc., may be trimmed)
9. Does may be horned or dehorned.

7. All rabbit/cavy ear numbers must be legible or the animal will be eliminated from competition.
8. Animals will be shown and judged in the proper divisions and class of breed, age and sex only. Rabbits that are disqualified because of permanent defects, deformities, or blemishes and those absent at the time of judging, do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the same class. Cavies will be broken into divisions after entry forms close.
9. A judge may disqualify a rabbit/cavy from competition because of a temporary or curable defect but the rabbit/cavy should be counted as an entry.
10. There must be at least five or more entries in a breed to constitute a division. If there is less than
