The Auction

The Junior Livestock Auction is the culmination of a year of livestock management by 4-H and FFA members, and Independents. The participating young men and women have spent the past year caring for and charting the progress of their chosen livestock animal: steer, lamb, hog, goat, rabbit, poultry pen or turkey. Their animals are exhibited in person where they are judged and graded. Only those that are market ready advance to Saturday's auction.

Supporting the Auction

Your purchase of an animal is integral to the continued success of these young adults' hard work. Committed to the process, they learn many valuable skills that may be applied to any number of future endeavors.

- Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communications, human relations, and social interaction.
- Builds character and promotes citizenship, volunteerism, and patriotism.
- Develops competent and assertive agricultural leadership.
- Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an agricultural career.
- Strengthens the confidence of agriculture students in themselves and their work.

The Bidding & Buying Process

As a prospective buyer, you will be provided with a list of livestock for sale. As each animal is led into the ring, the auctioneer asks for bids in dollar per pound. Indicate you are bidding by raising your buyer's card. As the bidding goes higher, you must raise your card again to indicate your continued interest in the lot. If you have the winning bid, a volunteer will present you with a sales invoice for your signature. On this form you will elect from the choices provided to have the animal butchered for your own use or resold. If you prefer to have the lot resold, you pay the difference between market price and your bid price. (Note: This is a terminal auction).

Estimated Yield of Your Purchase

Many factors affect the various cuts and quantities obtained from a carcass. However, here are a few guidelines of what you can anticipate from your purchase.

- Steers weigh between 1000-1350 pounds live and yield approximately 500 pounds of processed meat, to include up to 120 steaks, 35 roasts, and 90 pounds of ground beef, stew meat, ribs, etc.
- Hogs weigh between 220-280 pounds live and yield approximately 140 pounds of processed meat, to include up to 50 chops, four shoulder roasts, two sides of bacon, two hams, ribs, and sausage.
- Lambs weigh between 100-145 pounds live and yield approximately 60 pounds of processed meat, to include up to two legs of lamb, two shanks, spareribs, and stew meat.
- Goats weigh between 60 – 125 pounds live and yield approximately 40 pounds processed meat to include up to 50 chops, two legs of goat, two shanks, spareribs, and stew meat.
